

What is Prostate Cancer?

Prostate cancer is a disease where cells in the prostate grow and divide abnormally. It's the most common cancer to affect Canadian men. **One in nine men will be diagnosed** with the disease in their lifetime, with older men being most at risk. Chances of developing prostate cancer increase greatly after age 50, with nearly two out of three diagnosed men over the age of 65.

Fundraising is a key part of furthering the success rates of early detection and treatment of prostate cancer. Fundraised dollars are used for things like research grants, funding for equipment, bettering patient care, and supporting men currently suffering from the disease.

Our Impact

Raising Awareness in the Community

Beyond financial support, Dash 4 Dad drives meaningful change by raising awareness about prostate cancer. By bringing hundreds of people together, the event sparks conversations that might not otherwise happen and reminds families they aren't facing this disease alone.

This year, Dash 4 Dad also supported a free screening event for underserved populations, ensuring that more men have access to early detection.

Fuelling Research Through Grants

Dash 4 Dad provides crucial seed funding for research at LHSC. These grants, often in the range of \$30,000–\$50,000, enable urologists to pursue new ideas, build essential resources and launch projects that improve patient care.

What projects do these grants support?

- ➊ Dash 4 Dad support has enabled the creation of a prostate cancer biobank. By contributing to the team needed to collect and process these tumour samples, researchers can better understand why some cancers resist treatment.
- ➋ Other grants have focused on helping patients live well after treatment. For example, research led by Dr. Jeffrey Campbell is exploring ways to reduce side effects of prostate cancer therapies. Funding their work is currently pending ethics approval.

These early-stage projects are the building blocks that lead to bigger breakthroughs.



The Chin-Hardie Chair In Urologic Oncology

A portion of Dash 4 Dad's success helped establish the Chin-Hardie Chair in Urologic Oncology. With only about 20 Urologic Chairs in Canada, this role positions LHSC at the forefront of urologic cancer care.

Dr. Brant Inman was recruited as the inaugural Chin-Hardie Chair in September 2023 for a term of five years. He is a renowned specialist in prostate, bladder and kidney cancers. He is also an expert in various surgical techniques, from robotic and laparoscopic to open surgery. His role as the Chin-Hardie Chair enables him to lead groundbreaking research, transforming cancer care for patients in Southwestern Ontario.

Research empowered by the Chair

Dr. Inman is leading two novel studies with the potential to advance prostate cancer treatment:

TULSA vs. SURGERY:

For men with localized prostate cancer, the standard treatment—surgical removal of the prostate—often leads to lifelong side effects. This study is comparing surgery with the new TULSA procedure. This minimally-invasive technique uses real-time MRI-guided technology to guide the delivery of high-energy ultrasound to precisely heat and destroy the prostate cancer tissue in a way tailored to each patient, while protecting surrounding structures important for urinary and sexual function. If proven effective, TULSA could be a game-changer for quality of life.

PERSONALIZED PROSTATE CANCER THERAPY

This trial is testing whether treatments tailored to a tumour's genetics can improve patient outcomes. By sequencing each tumour's DNA and matching patients to therapies designed for their cancer type, the study is bringing precision medicine directly into prostate cancer care.

Transforming Care with PET-CT

Continued support has also reshaped diagnostic imaging at LHSC. Funds from Dash 4 Dad helped renovate a suite at Victoria Hospital (VH) to house a new Positron Emission Tomography (PET)-CT scanner.

Before this renovation, PET-CT scans were done on an aging machine at another site. The scanner frequently broke down, slowing service and creating long wait times.

Today, because of Dash 4 Dad, all prostate cancer PET-CT scans have moved to VH. Wait times have dropped dramatically—from two to three months to just two to three weeks. The faster, more reliable scanner is supporting patients with many types of cancer, not just prostate.

LHSC is now positioned to adopt new theranostic treatments like ¹⁷⁷Lu PSMA (Pluvicto), a radioactive drug that targets prostate cancer cells, while leaving other cells alone. This leads to fewer side effects than chemotherapy and improves survival rates.

“PET-CT use has grown dramatically over the past three years. Without the second PET-CT at VH, we would face significant issues with wait times. The PET-CT aligns well with the needs of our therapy programs and has facilitated the use of Ga-68-based PSMA agents for staging and restaging prostate cancer. Having the PET-CT at VH has been vital to ensuring this imaging program meets the demands of our patients.”

Dave Rigley had already faced prostate cancer once. After receiving brachytherapy—a treatment where tiny radioactive seeds are placed inside the prostate—he went into remission.

Then his prostate-specific antigen (PSA) levels started rising again, suggesting the cancer might be back. Bone scans, CT scans and MRIs all came back clear. According to the images, Dave was healthy. But he knew something was wrong.

“How can they treat something they can’t even see?” Dave wondered.

That question led him to Dr. Glenn Bauman, a radiation oncologist at LHSC. Dr. Bauman recommended a PSMA PET scan, a new form of imaging that uses a tracer to make prostate cancer cells “light up” on the screen. The results were undeniable. A small cluster of cancer cells was hiding beneath Dave’s pelvic bone—completely invisible to traditional scans.

“It lit up like a beacon,” recalls Dr. Bauman.

Because PET scanning revealed exactly where the cancer was, Dave could be treated with focused radiation rather than starting long-term drug therapies with difficult side effects. His cancer was successfully eradicated.

“Without that scan,” Dave says, “I’d still be waiting. Watching the clock. Wondering.”
